

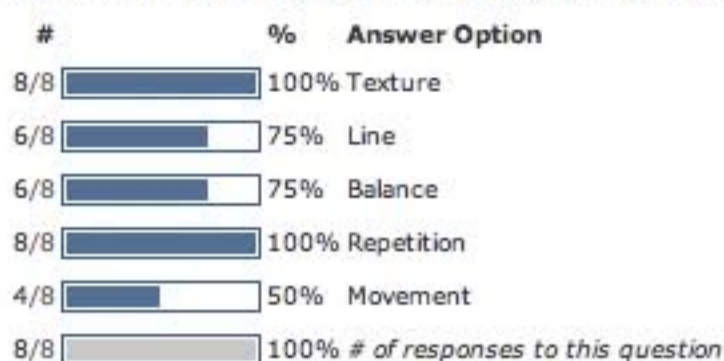

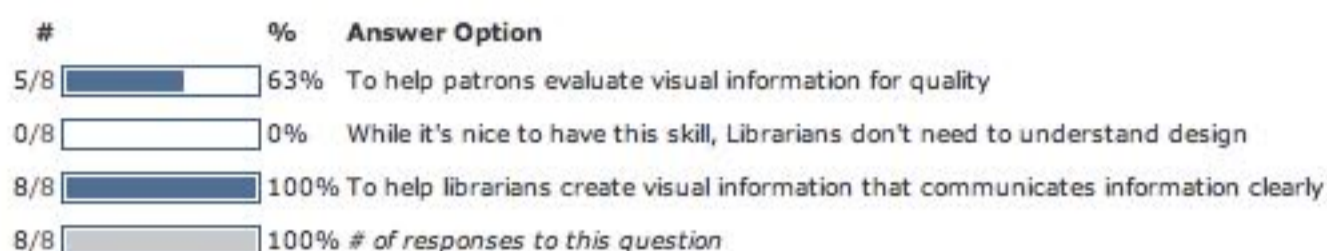

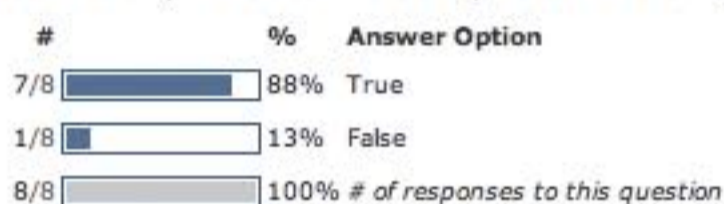
1. What elements or principles of design do you see in this picture?



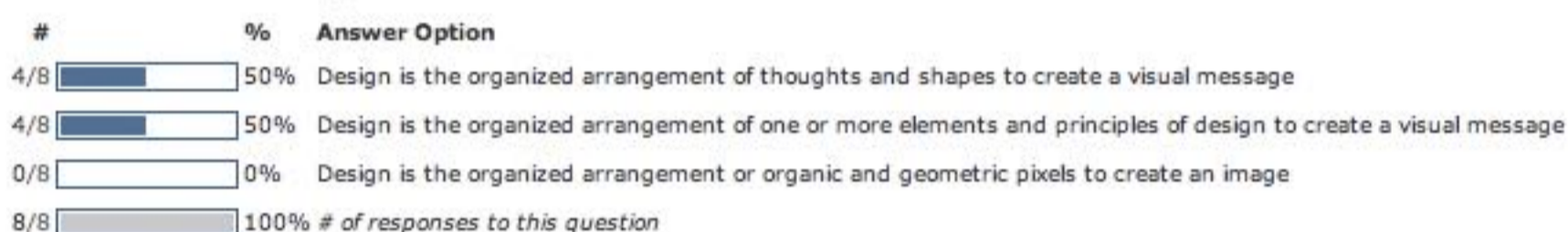
